



UNIFORM POLICY

Rationale:

The wearing of a regulation school uniform gives students a sense of pride and identity and enhances the school's image and reputation. The uniform will give students a unifying and equitable standard of dress so they can learn comfortably and safely.

Guidelines:

1. Details of uniform regulations will be published and promoted at enrolment, on the website and throughout the school. These will be reviewed regularly.
2. There will be dress guidelines for Year 13 students.
3. Enrolment of students will be accepted with an undertaking from the parent/caregiver that the uniform regulations will be adhered to.
4. Uniform must be worn correctly during the school day and to and from school.
5. The regulation uniform takes into account weather conditions so no additional items of clothing need to be visibly worn.
6. Students should be kept safe by wearing appropriate clothing and shoes must be appropriate for the subject taken.
7. The school accepts no liability for injuries from accidents involving piercings, or from failure to adhere to the regulations.
8. To maintain personal hygiene standards, students must wear a change of clothing for PE.
9. The principal and staff are responsible for monitoring the wearing of school uniform and may take all reasonable steps to ensure the policy and regulations are effectively adhered to.
10. Most uniform items will be available at the school uniform shop. These items will be selected to be cost effective and hard-wearing.

When the Board approved this Policy it agreed that no variations of this Policy or amendments to it could be made, except with the majority approval of the Board.
